

November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021

The Des Moines County Board of Supervisors met in regular session at the Court House in Burlington at 9 AM on Tuesday, November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2021 with Chairman Tom Broeker and Vice-Chair Jim Cary present. Member Shane McCampbell was present through Webex. This meeting was also held electronically via Webex and YouTube live streaming. Public input was available through board email or call in.

Unless otherwise noted, all motions passed unanimously. The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Meet with Department Heads: IT Director Colin Gerst stated his office is busy. Sheriff Kevin Glendening stated everything is going well in his office. The jail population is 66 with 3 adults and 1 juvenile out of county. County Auditor Terri Johnson stated her office remains busy working on redistricting that needs to be completed by January 15<sup>th</sup>. She reminded the Department Heads there is a budget meeting today at 11:30 a.m. at Starr's Cave Nature Center. Assistant Land Use Administrator Jared Lassiter reported there are several subdivisions out for review with one on the agenda for today. The office remains busy. Conservation Director Chris Lee reported their monthly board meeting is tomorrow. He submitted a fish habitat grant to build additional ponds at Big Hollow to go along with the water shed work they have been doing. CDS Director Ken Hyndman was present. County Treasurer Janelle Nalley-Londquist reported her office is busy. County Recorder Natalie Steffener stated that the window in the Recorder's office is now fixed and open for the public. Maintenance Supervisor Rodney Bliesener reported his staff is busy. Public Health Administrator Christa Poggemiller reported the current 7-day COVID positivity rate is 10% with 71 positive cases. Boosters are now open to anyone over the age of 18. This is available 6 months after your second shot of Pfizer or Moderna and 2 months after the single shot of Johnson & Johnson. Walk in clinics are still being offered Monday and Wednesday for adults and Thursdays for pediatric at the Public Health Department. County Engineer Brian Carter reported crews are working on projects such as ditching, slope repairs and stability repairs. Carter gives credit to his culvert crew for the great job they did on a project last week that was brought to their attention. North on Hwy 61, in the Mediapolis area, the driving lane changes have been made and should stay the same during the winter months.

Correspondence. Chairman Broeker read an email from Recorder Natalie Steffener. She learned in a meeting that effective January 1<sup>st</sup> the state will not allow counties to reimburse employees for hotel stays unless the hotel is certified in Human Trafficking prevention training. Our county is going to require "proof" such as a copy of the certificate in order to be reimbursed.

Resolution #2021-048 and Final Plat – Weyrick Subdivision was presented. This is a one-lot subdivision located in Pt. W1/2 SE1/4 Section 1, Danville Twp. Contains 16.23 acres. Owner/Subdivider is Mary Weyrick of 14134 Lynx Road, Danville. Cary motioned to approve and seconded by Broeker.
