The Des Moines County Board of Supervisors met in a regular session at the Court House in Burlington at 9:00 AM on Wednesday, November 12, 2025, with Chair Jim Cary, Vice-Chair Shane McCampbell, and Member Tom Broeker present. This meeting was also held electronically via Webex and YouTube live streaming. Public input was available through board email or call in.

Unless otherwise noted, all motions passed unanimously. The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Meeting with Department Heads: County Auditor Sara Doty reported she is busy working on wrapping up the Election. The 1st Tier canvass is on the agenda today and she will report on the 2nd Tier next week. IT Director Brandon Mehmert reported his office is busy. Emergency Management Director Shannon Prado stated her office is busy. Maintenance Director Rodney Bliesener stated he has a new hire starting next week. The Treasurer's Office had a new drop ceiling installed over the weekend, and the County Attorney's Office had their restroom lines fixed. Sheriff Kevin Glendening reported the jail population is 83. He explained his office is continuing to see a lot of challenges with mental health and finding placement.
