

March 10, 2026

The Des Moines County Board of Supervisors met in a regular session at the Court House in Burlington at 9:00 AM on Tuesday, March 10th, 2026, with Chair Shane McCampbell, Vice Chair Tom Broeker and Member Jim Cary present. The meeting was also held electronically via Webex and YouTube live streaming. Public input was available through board email or call in.

Unless otherwise noted, all motions passed unanimously. The Pledge of Allegiance was conducted.

Meeting with Department Heads: County Auditor Sara Doty reported the Primary Election filing period is still underway until March 20th at 5:00 P.M. She and Cheryl will be out of the office at the end of this week for our annual Spring ISAC Conference. Assistant Land Use Administrator Jarred Lassiter reported his office is busy and they have an agenda item. Veterans Affairs Director Brooke Marland stated Coffee & Conversation will take place tomorrow morning at Wake-N-Bake at 9:00 A.M. Conservation Director Chris Lee reported he is currently working on grant projects. His crew is working on getting the parks going for the spring. County Attorney Lisa Schaefer stated there was a homicide that took place over the weekend. Her office remains busy in court. County Treasurer Janelle Nalley-Londquist reported her office is busy. She wants to remind the public that the 2nd half of property taxes are due at the end of March. Maintenance Director Rodney Bliesener reported his crew is busy. IT Director Brandon Mehmert stated his office is busy. Sheriff Kevin Glendening reported the jail population is at 84. They will attend a career fair tomorrow at Mediapolis High School. County Engineer Brian Carter reported the contracted Rock Haul has been completed. The county rock haul has begun in other areas of the county.

Gena Parsons and Mike Baker with Danville Telecom presented the Board of Supervisors with the current maps for the Fiber Infrastructure that will be taking place in Des Moines County. Des Moines County granted Danville Telecom \$355,000.00 of ARPA funds to build out fiber infrastructure to underserved areas in Des Moines County. This project and maps were approved in 2020. They are now ready to move forward with the project and are here to give the Board of Supervisors an update on the project.

Approval of Resolution #2026-017 and Final Plat of First Addition to Hidden Prairie Subdivision was presented. Assistant Land Use Administrator Jarred Lassiter spoke on this and recommended approval. Cary made a motion to approve and was seconded by Broeker.

WHEREAS Section 354.8 of the Code of Iowa states that a governing body shall certify by resolution the approval of a subdivision plat, and,

WHEREAS the Final Plat for **First Addition to Hidden Prairie Subdivision** has been reviewed for conformance to applicable County standards by the Des Moines County Auditor, Health Department, Secondary Roads Department, and Land Use Department and has been duly recommended by the aforementioned entities for approval,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the Final Plat of **First Addition to Hidden Prairie Subdivision**, with the following condition:

- A permit for an Onsite Waste Water Treatment System shall be obtained from the Des Moines County Health Department prior to construction of a new residence, and a code compliant system shall be installed prior to its habitation.

Broeker attended an Emergency Management Meeting. McCampbell attended a Conservation Board and Workforce Development Board meeting.


During public input, Tom Upton stated that it takes a lot to be a Board of Supervisor and would like to thank the Board for their hard work. He and his wife were here to show their support today.
